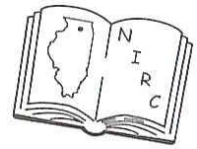

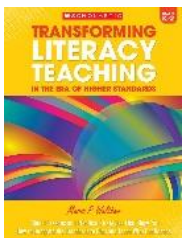

5:30-6:15 Keynote speaker, Dr. Maria Walther: "Assess, Decide, and Guide: The Keys to Helping All Readers Succeed K-5". Dr. Walther has a doctorate in elementary education from Northern Illinois University and has taught first grade since 1986. She currently teaches at Gwendolyn Books Elementary School in Aurora, Il. She shares her ideas with teachers around the country, at seminars through Staff Development Resources and as an independent consultant. She was awarded the 2008 ICARE for Reading Award by the Illinois Council for Affective Reading Education in recognition of outstanding contributions to fostering the love of reading in children!

***Dr. Lou Ferroli, "Dyslexia: From Doubt to Definition to Diagnosis to Doing Something About It" (General audience)** Dr. Ferroli, Professor Emeritus, is current President of the Illinois Reading Council and Chair of the Budget, Finance and Strategic IRC Committee. He was a professor at Rockford College for 23 years. He was inducted in the IRC Hall of Fame in 2011. He has chaired the Obama Literacy Fund Committee of IRC and has been the author of the "Cool Studies" column in the IRC Communicator.

***Becky Anderson Wilkins, Book Talk K-4,** Becky Anderson serves on the IRC Illinois Reads Committee. She is co-owner of Anderson's Bookshops in Naperville and Downers Grove and has been president of the American Booksellers Association, the Association of Booksellers for Children and the Great Lakes Booksellers Association.

***Renee Corcoran & Tracy Jaconette, "It's all about the past, about the past, about the past...Pack your bags and fasten your seatbelts, as we travel across the globe and through the years to teach you our secrets for reading, writing and loving historical fiction! ***Dr. Jerry Johns and Joan Bereman, “Engaging Fluency Strategies Consistent with the Common Core,”** *Dr. Johns is the former President of the International Reading Association (2002-2003), IRC President(1981-1982), President, College Reading Association (1988-1989), Professor Emeritus at Northern Illinois University, and a distinguished author and researcher. Joan Bereman, is the Immediate Past President of Northern Illinois Reading Council and serves also as secretary of NIRC. She presently works as a Reading Specialist at Gwendolyn Brooks Elementary School in DeKalb, Illinois. Formerly Joan taught in both the Aurora and Sycamore areas.*

***Kristy Rauch and Kari Bartholomew, “Facilitating Student Talk, Thinking and Interaction”,** K-8 Center for the Collaborative Classroom. **This session will provide practical facilitation strategies to support teachers so classrooms are connected learning communities where students lead the talking, thinking, interaction and learning.
