
Join the Fox Valley Board members as we participate in this Educator book club with Anderson's Bookshop.






This is a School

This is a Story


This is a Story shows the many ways in which books can foster connection, understanding, and empower children to change the world through their own passions — a beautiful love letter to the library.



The Gift of Story



This story is a powerful testament to silencing destructive inside voices, articulating and managing pain, and embracing yourself, support, and love.




Welcome to Fox Valley's Wine, Dine, & Collaborate!

Come network with fellow teachers and enjoy a glass of wine and some snacks on a large charcuterie board at FVRC's annual Wine, Dine, & Collaborate!






